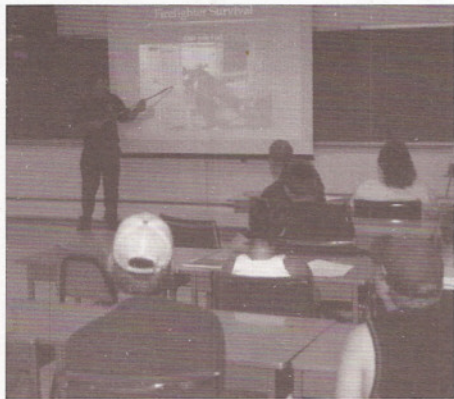

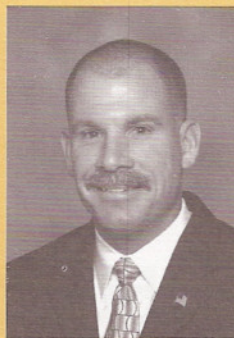

Tim previously served as the Chief of Fire Training for Savannah Fire & Emergency Services, GA, Assistant Fire Chief for Missouri City Fire & Rescue Services, TX and as a Firefighter/Paramedic with the Kansas City Fire Department. Tim is the editor of the International Society of Fire Service Instructors (ISFSI) publication, "The Instructor," and a contributing author to numerous other publications. He is the writer/developer of the featured "SURVIVAL!" program on Fire & Emergency Television Network (FETN). In addition to his accomplishments as a writer, Tim has been a featured speaker in more than 25 US states and five Canadian provinces. In July 2002, Tim was awarded the prestigious Innovator of the Year Award from the ISFSI for his innovative training ideas and concepts in the area of firefighter safety and survival. Most recently, Tim presented the keynote address for the 2007 Fire Department Instructors Conference (FDIC) in Indianapolis, IN.

Managing Risk in the Fire Department - The Health and Safety Officer's Responsibilities

It highlights the use of health maintenance in managing risk, as well as the use of FAST. This program also describes the element of rehab in risk management.

Chief Richard A. French has 35 years emergency services experience, serving actively throughout the ranks of the DeFreestville Fire Department. He is currently Chief of Department, having previously served in that capacity from 1987 to 1991. He is also assigned as a Safety Officer on both NY IMAT, the NYS Emergency Management Assistance Team and on NY TF-2, the NYS Urban Technical Search and Rescue Team. Richard is currently a NYS Fire Instructor, a local Emergency Medical Services Instructor and a member of the faculty at the NYS Academy of Fire Science. During 2003, he was honored with the Fred W. Singer Fire Educator of the Year Award by the NYS Association of Fire Chiefs. Richard has worked numerous deployments in NYS, serving either in Operations or as the Safety Officer. During 2004, he worked as the Deputy Operations Chief for the City of Jacksonville, FL immediately following Hurricane Charlie and worked as Operations Chief for Okaloosa County, FL following Hurricane Ivan. During 2005, Chief French worked as the Safety Officer in Santa Rosa County, FL following Hurricane Dennis, and in Jackson County, MS immediately following Hurricane Katrina.
